MEETING MINUTES

FEBRUARY 18, 2021

Due to the current COVID-19 State of Emergency and in compliance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-8, et seq., the Authority conducted its regularly scheduled Board Meeting on February 18, 2021 with the Members and staff participating by way of teleconference.

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and began the meeting with the Statement of Public Notice (Sunshine Law), attached and caused same to be entered into the minutes of the meeting.

All Members in the meeting acknowledged that they could hear the Secretary and other participants.

Also present were the following: Laura Cummings, Executive Director; Charles Maggio, Chief Financial Officer; Jeff Elam, Chief Engineer; Basil D'Armiento, Operations Director; Drew Saskowitz, Water Quality Superintendent; Alexis Bozza, Executive Administrative Assistant; Sidney D. Weiss, Esq., General Counsel to the Authority; and David J. Ruitenberg, Esq., Murphy McKeon.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Chairman Huber stated the next portion of the meeting was set aside for public discussion and asked if any members of the public were present and would like to address the Board, to please state their full name for the record.

Jim Barnhill, Assistant Shop Steward of New Jersey Water Utilities United Local No. 1, introduced himself and provided the following statement:

I would like to start with the fact that I am not speaking from Matt Ciampi or myself but for all the Union members working through many difficult [inaudible] circumstances. We work through dangerous weather conditions and COVID19 when most people work from home. Our crews are being depleted while there is a constant increase in management and supervisors. New supervisors with minimal experience are replacing supervisors that were experienced and

knowledgeable. More money is spent on consultants, outside contracting and surplus management, while the Union members, which is the backbone of the company, have tried for over two years to get a reasonable contract. We have been ignored cost of living increases while our paycheck is stagnant. Dedicated employees are leaving because of a lack of appreciation for our diligence. We are eager to settle a contract that is fair to us so we can continue in good faith. Thank you.

Matthew Ciampi, Business Agent and Shop Steward of New Jersey Water Utilities United Local No. 1, introduced himself and provided the following statement:

Good evening. I am here tonight with Jim to speak on behalf of the members of the Union. At the end of January, the distribution crew has worked around the clock to ensure service has been kept and restored for the customers of the Authority. We have accomplished this with barely any manpower. Before a preventable accident occurred on January 29th, we had 10 men overseeing 35 square miles of this infrastructure. After that accident, we held the system toaether with barely six or seven workers during the day to handle break after break. Until recently, we have gotten our staffing level back to full workers, but this is still not enough to accomplish daily tasks to ensure the system is upkept. It has come to the point if one or two workers take off, it hurts daily operations. This should not be the case. I or any worker's families should not have to wonder if they will be home at 4:00 PM or will it be another late night. Yet you may ask how and why there are only 10 members right now in the distribution crew and the simple answer is the lack of planning, more employees leaving and the failure to properly hire within a certain time limit. We the workers are presented with the challenge and needed every day, but it appears to go unnoticed. We receive no "thank you", no "good job", but instead we are met with "hey we have another break" and "who is staying". And yet what is lingering in the background is 25 months without a contract, without a raise, without labor peace. Under normal conditions, we would not work how hard or how much but we at Local 1 are different. We are all hardworking individuals, prideful workers, who want fairness. The Authority continues to challenge us, to set us up for failure, but we stand together and get the job done. The Board needs to understand that this does come at a great cost. With a major reduction in manpower, the workers who are left picking up the pieces are putting a great stress on their own personal lives and families. The Board needs to see and understand there is a human side in all of this. Yet again, we have not gotten a raise or a contract in 25 months. We were willing to negotiate, we were willing to settle, but it's hard to negotiate with one party who only believes that their side is the correct way. We wish the labor peace can be achieved but we also understand, as we continue to speak at Board meetings, that we feel it falls on deaf ears. Please send us the assistance we need to achieve this labor peace. Thank you for your time.

Chairman Huber asked if any other members of the public were present and would like to address the Board. No one responded. He then closed the public portion of the meeting.

B. Resolution Authorizing Use of Vendor through the North Jersey Wastewater Cooperative Pricing System

C. Resolution Rejecting Certain Bid as Nonresponsive and Authorizing Award of a Contract for On-Call Water Main and Appurtenances Repair, Installation, Testing and Startup

The Authority advertised for public bids pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law in connection with on-call water main and appurtenances repair, installation, testing and startup. Five bids were received on January 21, 2021. The bids have been reviewed by the Authority's Chief Engineer as set forth in a memorandum dated February 12, 2021, a copy of which memorandum was reviewed by the Members. It was determined that the lowest bid received by Shauger Property Services, in the amount of \$263,750.00, does not meet the requirements set forth in the bid specifications for the reasons set forth in the memorandum. The Chief Engineer recommended that the contract be awarded to Reivax Contracting for its second low and responsive bid in the amount of \$332,251.00. Chairman Huber stated that the Treasurer certified that funds are available. Member Baldassari offered the following resolution:

D. Resolution Awarding Contract for Wing Well Pumping Station Variable Frequency Drive Replacement

The Chief Engineer reported that the Authority has a need to replace the variable frequency drive motor controller at its Wing Well Pumping Station. Proposals were requested from five companies where four submitted proposals. The proposals were reviewed by the Chief Engineer as set forth in a memorandum dated February 16, 2021, a copy of which was reviewed by the Members. The Chief Engineer recommended that the contract be awarded to Longo Electrical–Mechanical Inc. (Longo) for its low responsive proposal of \$25,800.00. Longo completed and submitted Business Entity Disclosure Certifications which certify that they have not made any reportable contributions to any political or candidate committee in the Township of Hanover, Borough of Morris Plains, Town of Morristown and the Township of Morris in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit them from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract.

E. Resolution Authorizing Amendment to Professional Service Contract with Aquarius Engineering for Safe Drinking Water Act Compliance and Related Matters

The Members reviewed a memorandum from the Executive Director dated February 11, 2021. Ms. Cummings stated that the Authority entered into a professional service contract with Aquarius Engineering LLC (Aquarius) for professional engineering services in connection with Safe Drinking Water Act compliance and related matters in the amount of \$17,000.00. She added that SMCMUA is undertaking significant distribution system upgrades to both treatment and infrastructure. In order to support SMCMUA in these efforts, a supplemental proposal was requested from Aquarius for additional services needed to update the annual Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) report with monitoring data, graphs and statistical analysis; addition of LCR compliance activities undertaken in 2020; and a summary of the major new requirements of the updated LCR published January 15, 2021. In addition, assistance is needed with implementation of the new corrosion control treatment systems during the startup and initial monitoring and operations, and with service line replacement strategies, practices, and operations during the Water Supply Improvement Project. It was recommended that an amendment be authorized for the additional services in the not to exceed amount of \$18,500.00. The total amount of the contract would not exceed \$35,500.00. The Treasurer certified funds are available in the 2021 Budget. Member Baldassari offered the following resolution:

G. Resolution Authorizing Amendment to Professional Service Contract with CDM Smith for Design of Groundwater Facilities Chemical Feed Systems, Chlorine Contact Improvements and Related Matters

The Members reviewed a memorandum from the Executive Director dated February 16, 2021. The Authority entered into a professional service contract with CDM Smith for professional engineering services in connection with the design of groundwater facilities chemical feed systems, chlorine contact improvements and related matters on 9/22/17, amended on 6/21/18 and 1/24/19, for a current contract amount of \$502,944. The chemical feed and associated building improvements included upgraded or new corrosion control treatment facilities designed as part of the corrosion control optimization program for SMCMUA's distribution system. These systems are now under construction. This amendment is to provide specific regulatory compliance and related matters support in accordance with the current LCR and the recently published Revised LCR for an additional cost of \$28,200.00. The total amended contract amount would not exceed \$531,144.00. The Treasurer has certified funds are available. Member Baldassari offered the following resolution:

The project scope is to furnish labor, equipment and material for the emergency and non-emergency repair of water main and appurtenances, installation, testing and startup services within the SMCMUA's service area. Appurtenances include, but are not limited to, service lines, connecting pipes, hydrants, valves, meter pits, and flushing devices. Emergency repair response time will be within four (4) hours of notification. Non-emergency repairs and installations will be scheduled on an as-needed basis.

The project driver is to provide additional coverage to the SMCMUA staff for emergency callouts and non-emergency repairs and installations in order to maintain the provisions of the water supply to the general public for drinking water and fire protection.

The lowest bid, submitted by Shauger Property Services, Inc., has been rejected because the bid is not responsive to the required specifications in that their bid prices did not include the cost for materials. The second lowest bid, submitted by Reivax Contracting Corporation, for the described work for labor, equipment and materials is competitive and cost appropriate. There were no discrepancies discovered in Reivax Contracting Corporation's bid documents.

In summary, it is recommended that a contract be awarded to Reivax Contracting Corporation in the amount not to exceed \$332,251.00.

The Treasurer has certified that sufficient funds are available in the Budget. Table 1 provides a summary of the account to be charged for this Contract.
